The event will provide interactive demonstrations, focussed on measuring the effects of ageing and age associated degenerative conditions.

Members of the JWMDRC team will be present on the day, displaying some of the work that is key to our success and impact in the neuromuscular field. This will include a focus on the importance and challenge of clinical research and diagnostics in rare diseases.

The JWMDRC was launched in November 2014. The Centre brings together and consolidates Newcastle Universities' distinguished, international and world-leading record in research and care for neuromuscular diseases.

The team, based at the Institute of Genetic Medicine, Newcastle University and its associated hospitals, work together towards the development and application of genomic and translational medicine to improve the health outcomes of people living with neuromuscular diseases.

In addition to the JWMDRC, representatives from Parkinson's UK, The Alzheimer's Society, DeNDRoN, and The Newcastle Brain Tissue Bank will have individual stalls providing useful information.
